

1. General situation


Type of the Disaster : COVID-19 pandemic
Date and Time the Disaster occurred : Ongoing
Location of the Disaster : NATO Allied and partner nations, and others

1.1. This situation report only highlights confirmed developments since the last EADRCC Situation Report (OPS(EADRCC)(2020)0086). Except for the summary in paragraphs 1.2 and 1.3, previously reported information is not included in this report. An overview of outstanding requests is available in Enclosure 1, attached to this document.

1.2. So far, six allied and seven partner nations have requested international assistance through the Euro-Atlantic Disaster Response Coordination Centre (EADRCC). In chronological order of requesting, these are: Ukraine, Spain, Montenegro, Italy, Albania, the Republic of North Macedonia, the Republic of Moldova, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Georgia, Colombia, Slovenia, Afghanistan, and Mongolia.

1.3. To date, eleven requests from International assistance remain active. The requests for international assistance received from Spain on 23rd March 2020, and from Italy on 26th March 2020, are now closed.

2. Closed requests for assistance

2.1. On the 29th March 2020, **Italy** provided the following update assessment to its international request for assistance.

- “Considering the present contingencies and the evolution – at the national level – of the situation in Italy, the Italian Authorities have decided they no longer need the items listed in the EADRCC request for international assistance. Under present circumstances, this will allow future donors to focus on other nations where these resources are needed and particularly scarce.”

3. New requests for international assistance through the EADRCC

3.1. On 24 April, **Mongolia** requested international assistance through the EADRCC (distributed as OPS(EADRCC)(2020)0087).

4. Update to existing requests for international assistance

4.1. Revised requests were distributed for **Afghanistan** (OPS(EADRCC)(2020)0085 (REV1)) and **Albania** (OPS(EADRCC)(2020)0069(REV3)).

4.2. EADRCC has issued corrigenda to requests from **Italy** (OPS(EADRCC)(2020)0068(REV1)-COR1)) and from **Mongolia** (OPS(EADRCC)(2020)0087(COR1)).


4.3. Allies and partners are highly encouraged to inform EADRCC when any requested support is received so that their requests for international assistance can be updated accordingly. This will help to ensure that assistance is provided in accordance with up-to-date requirements. Nations are also encouraged to prioritize their requirements where possible.

5. Completed bilateral assistance in response to EADRCC requests

5.1. In response to Moldova’s request for assistance through the EADRCC, on 28 April Hungary provided 100 000 masks and 5 000 protective overalls.

5.2. In response to the requests for assistance from Armenia, Georgia, Moldova and Ukraine, Lithuania allocated EUR 100 000 for the provision of humanitarian aid to those countries. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Lithuania will organize the purchase of protective items, for delivery to the places specified by Armenia, Georgia, Moldova and Ukraine.

5.3. The United States, through US European Command, provided the following supplies to Moldova (interior ministry) on 25 April: 500 respirators, 379 protection suits, 101 pairs of

protective gloves, 48 pairs of protective goggles, 6 bullhorns, 18 sleeping bags, 10 sleeping cots, and 9 diesel air heaters.

5.4. The United States, through US European Command, provided the following supplies to Montenegro (Podgorica Clinical Centre) on 23 April: 210 infusion sets (VLSToolIFG 270 cm), 3 Drager Vista 120 patient monitors, and 1 infusion pump (VOLUMAT MC AGILIA INT).

5.5. The United States (via US EUCOM) responded to Bosnia-Herzegovina's request for medical assistance by providing to the Ministry of Interior of the Federation of BiH and the Ministry of Interior of Republika Srpska the following items on 27 April: 12 500 surgical 3-layer masks, 10 000 various sized surgical gloves, 500 sets of protective eye goggles, and 300 face shields.

5.6. In addition to the previous US support to Allies and partners via the US Agency for International Development (USAID) that had already been reported to the EADRCC, the following support via USAID is also underway to Italy: \$50 million to expand and supplement the work of public international organizations, non-governmental organizations, and faith-based groups responding to the pandemic in Italy and mitigating its social and community impact. USAID will also purchase health commodities and work to support Italian companies engaged in developing and producing medical equipment and supplies for COVID-19.

6. Ongoing offers of bilateral assistance in response to EADRCC requests


6.1. Georgia has reported that the United States, through the US Defense Threat Reduction Agency and the US Office of Defense Cooperation, will donate special equipment and hygiene items to Georgia.

6.2. Georgia has reported a pending donation from the United Kingdom.

7. Other bilateral assistance reported to the EADRCC

7.1. The Ukrainian state enterprise "Antonov" provided more than 20 cargo airlifts with medical supplies from China to recipients all over the world, using AN-225 "Mriya" and "AN-124 "Ruslan" aircraft.

7.2. In response to the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic among Allies and partners, the United States (through USAID) has provided approximately \$12.4 million in assistance as of April 17 to Albania, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Georgia, Kosovo, Moldova, North Macedonia, Serbia, and Ukraine to help activate case management and surveillance mechanisms, prepare laboratory systems, support IPC in health facilities, and share risk communication information with at-risk populations throughout the region.

7.3. Greece, through the EU CPM, received from the Czech Republic 6 100 items of bedding (mattresses, sleeping bags, blankets, bedsheets, and pillow and blanket covers) and tens of thousands of essential sanitary and hygiene items.

7.4. Italy and Spain, from Taiwan via the EU/ERCC, received 1 million surgical masks.

7.5. Greece, through the EU CPM, received from The Netherlands one medical station (hospital unit with 62 low/medium care beds plus 4 intensive care beds, including equipment, generators, and air conditioners).

7.6. The Netherlands has reported their donation of 38 400 litres of disinfectant gel to Italy on 24 April.

7.7. Israel has reported the following assistance to NATO partners.

- Serbia - procurement of goods and hygiene products for the elderly.
- Georgia: procurement of equipment to a children's Down syndrome care center.
- Uzbekistan: procurement of PPE for cancer patients.
