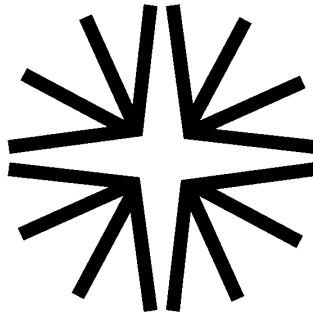

1. In accordance with the procedures at reference, EADRCC has received on Friday 12 June 2020, a second request for international assistance by the Republic of Moldova. The following information was provided.

2. General situation

Type of the Disaster : COVID-19 pandemic
Date and Time the Disaster occurred : 7 March 2020 and ongoing
Location of the Disaster : Republic of Moldova

3. Assessment of the damage and description of the situation

3.1. The Ministry of Health, Labour and Social Protection, Republic of Moldova request international assistance in their response to the global pandemic of the coronavirus COVID-19.

3.2. In order to prevent the spread of the virus in the Republic of Moldova, we ask our international partners to provide assistance to the Ministry of Health, Labour and Social Protection, Republic of Moldova in supplying humanitarian assistance.

3.3. The Republic of Moldova is dealing with the COVID-19 outbreak. As of 12 June 2020, there are 10727 confirmed cases of COVID-19. Thus far, the Republic of Moldova registered 382 deceased and 6229 recovered persons.

3.4. The main institution dealing with the crisis is the Ministry of Health, Labour and Social Protection. The specialized medical institutions of the Ministry of Interior and Ministry of Defence are also involved.



3.5. The Republic of Moldova declared the state of emergency on 17 March 2020 for 60 days. Subsequently, on May 16, in the Republic of Moldova was declared the state of emergency in public health, which will last until June 30, 2020.
