1. General situation

Type of the Disaster : COVID-19 pandemic
Date and Time the Disaster occurred : Ongoing
Location of the Disaster : NATO Allied and partner nations, and others

1.1. This situation report only highlights confirmed developments since the last EADRCC Situation Report (OPS(EADRCC)(2020)0104). Except for the summary in paragraphs 1.2 and 1.3, previously reported information is not included in this report.

1.2. So far, seven allied and nine partner nations have requested international assistance through the Euro-Atlantic Disaster Response Coordination Centre (EADRCC). In chronological order of requesting, these are: Ukraine, Spain, Montenegro, Italy, Albania, the Republic of North Macedonia, the Republic of Moldova, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Georgia, Colombia, Slovenia, Afghanistan, Mongolia, Bulgaria, Tunisia and Iraq. In addition, the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (UN OCHA) also requested international assistance through the EADRCC. Due to ongoing developments, the Republic of Moldova issued a second request for international assistance.

1.3. To date, thirteen requests for international assistance remain active. The requests for international assistance received from Spain on 23rd March 2020, from Italy on 26th March 2020, from Slovenia on 14th April 2020, from Bulgaria on 5th May 2020 and from Montenegro on 26th March 2020 are now closed.

4. Update to existing requests for international assistance

4.1. No new updates to report.

4.2. Allies and partners are highly encouraged to inform EADRCC when any requested support is received so that their requests for international assistance can be updated accordingly. This will help to ensure that assistance is provided in accordance with up-to-date requirements. Nations are also encouraged to prioritize their requirements where possible. The EADRCC further encourages nations to assess whether international assistance is still required under current circumstances or whether their requests can be closed at this time.

5. Completed bilateral assistance in response to EADRCC requests

5.1. On 24 June, **Poland** delivered to Ukraine in the framework of International Solidarity Fund, 40 000 protective masks, 50 000 gloves, c.a. 18 000 visors, c.a. 130 000 l sanitizing liquid and 1 000 protective suits.

5.2. On 24 June, **Poland** delivered to Moldova, in the framework of International Solidarity Fund, 30 000 protective masks, 4 800 visors, 20 000 l sanitizing liquid.

5.3. On 25 June, **Denmark** offered PPE to Georgia.

5.4. On 30 June, as part of Allied support in response to the COVID-19, **Turkey** delivered critical medical supplies to Iraq as a sign of solidarity between two neighboring countries. The delivery, consisted of various medicines, ventilators, testing kits, N95 masks, among others and was transported by an A400 aircraft of the Turkish Air Force.

6. Ongoing offers of bilateral assistance in response to EADRCC requests

6.1. **Spain** has reported the following assistance to be provided to Iraq to fight the COVID-19 pandemic:

- Disposable face masks 500 000
- N95 face masks 1 000

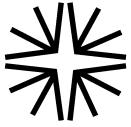

6.2. The **United Kingdom** is in the process of transporting a field hospital for the World Food Program (WFP) from the UK to Accra (Ghana). For this task, the United Kingdom has allocated one RAF C17, which is expected to complete 4 rotations; the first one took place on 27 June and the last one is scheduled for 9 July.

6.3. The **United States**, through the United States Agency for International Development (USAID), delivered 200 highly specialized, state-of-the-art portable ventilators to Colombia for intensive care units. In addition, USAID is providing training on the proper use and

maintenance of this specialized equipment. Beyond this donation, the United States has provided more than \$30 million in aid to combat the COVID-19 pandemic in Colombia

7. Other bilateral assistance reported to the EADRCC

7.1. On 24 June, **Germany** offered to deploy one EMT to Armenia. Official acceptance is expected to take place in the upcoming days.
