

William R. Silkworth

William Silkworth is the Minister-Counselor for Economic Affairs at the United States Embassy in Rome, Italy. A career member of the Senior Foreign Service, Mr. Silkworth has worked for the U.S. Department of State since 1988. Since his initial assignment to Guatemala as a consular officer, he has held positions managing economic, commercial, and/or political affairs at United States Embassies in Jordan, Turkmenistan, Russia, and the Czech Republic.

Mr. Silkworth also has served stints in Afghanistan and Iraq. In Afghanistan, he was the political officer with reporting responsibility for five northern provinces – a responsibility he exercised while based at a multi-national Provincial Reconstruction Team (PRT) in Mazar-e-Sharif. In Iraq, he was Deputy Principal Officer of the United States Consulate General in Erbil, overseeing the work of management, consular, and policy officers.

Mr. Silkworth's prior positions at the State Department have included service in the Bureaus of Economic and Business Affairs, Near Eastern Affairs, and European and Eurasian Affairs. His most recent supervisory position in the State Department was as Director for Europe, the Western Hemisphere, and Africa in the Bureau of Energy and Natural Resources.

Mr. Silkworth holds a Bachelor of Arts in History from the College of William and Mary and a Master of Arts in American History from the University of Illinois-Chicago.
