

1. In accordance with the procedures at reference, NATO has received on 05 February 2015, a disaster assistance request from Albania (AL).

The following information has been provided:

2. General Situation

Type of the Disaster : Snowfall and heavy rainfalls causing floods

Date and Time the Disaster occurred : 31 January 2015

Location of the Disaster : North and South parts of Albania

- **3.** Assessment of the situation:
- **3.1.** Due to heavy rainfalls that started on the 31st of January 2015, the water level of large rivers has increased and caused floods in several parts of Albania.
- **3.2.** According to the information provided by General Directorate for Civil Emergencies Ministry of Internal Affairs of Albania, the situation is improving, since the water level of Vjosa River, Drino River, Osumi River, Gjanica River is decreasing.





- 3.3. The most affected areas are Vlora and Fieri district in South of Albania. Currently, approximately, 2143 ha of land and 34 building/houses are flooded, 324 businesses are affected and 49.898 livestock are dead.
- **3.4.** Unfortunately, there has also been one casualty due to the flooding.
- **3.5.** Several cases of road damages have been reported and there are traffic restrictions due to the small and medium scale landslides.
- 3.6. As a result of high discharges of the hydro power plant, approximately 200 ha have been flooded in Shkodra district, where some villages have been affected.
- **3.7.** The "Maskurie" water reservoir situated in the Municipality of Kavaja of the district of Tirana, has been over flown as a result of the precipitation during the last days, which has increased the risk of breaking the dam.
- 3.8. The situation in the flooded areas is foreseen to further improve in the coming hours.
- 4. National resources involved in disaster response.
- **4.1.** Relevant state institutions and operational forces (military forces, police forces, firefighter personal, Albania Red Cross, Emergencies voluntary forces) have been activated in consequence management operations.
- **4.2.** Many non-government organizations (NGOs) are included in delivery in food supplies for the affected families.
- 5. International Assistance.
- 5.1. Assistance offered by Allies and Partners:
 - **5.1.1** Austria has offered the following assistance through the Union Civil Protection Mechanism:
 - Non food items
 - 1000 blankets (Red Cross Standard, 150x200cm, 50% wool, 50% synt.)
 - o 500 field beds
 - o 20 family tents (model 350) for up to 8 persons
 - Equipment
 - 8 petrol driven power generators ((4 units 11 kVA type: MAG 120SL-BD and 4 units 8 kVA);
 - **5.1.2** Bosnia and Herzegovina provided the following assistance:
 - Food (3000 kg Flour, 2000 I Oil, 2000 kg Sugar, 1000 kg Canned chicken meat.)



- Non food items
 - o 20 Tents, 20 sleeping bags, 400 blankets, 5 folding beds,
 - o Cloths (20 Raincoat, 120 Work Pants, 120 Work jackets, 100 belt)
 - 1000 | Disinfectant.
 - o 300 Snow shovel,
 - o 40 Canisters,
 - o 300 Sand bags
- Equipment
 - 15 heaters for drying walls,
 - 12 Generators,
 - 10 Sludge pumps inox 900 W;
- 5.1.3 <u>France</u> has offered one team (4 persons) to assess the situation through the Union Civil Protection Mechanism;
- 5.1.4 <u>Israel provided non-food items</u> (evaluated at 5.000 USD) and 1000 USD through its Embassy in Tirana.
- 5.1.5 Serbia has offered 50.000 USD;
- **5.1.6** Slovakia has offered the following assistance through the Union Civil Protection Mechanism:
 - Non food items
 - 48 sleeping beds, 336 blankets, 2000 towels
 - 120 boots, 2000 rainproof suits, 120 winter coats
 - Equipment
 - 3 generators (4,8 kW)
 - 6 suction pumps;
- **5.1.7** Turkey has offered 2 trucks with food;
- 5.2. Other international assistance:
 - **5.2.1.** <u>Arbeiter Samariter Bund</u> (ASB) First Assistance Samaritan Teams (FAST) Germany has sent one team to assess situation in affected area.
 - 5.2.2. Canadian Red Cross has offered 30.000 C\$;
 - 5.2.3. <u>Italian association "Misericordia"</u> has offered some pharmaceutical products for human and animal use;
 - 5.2.4. The Netherlands Red Cross has offered 250.000 USD;
 - 5.2.5. <u>The business community in Kosovo</u> provided 15 trucks with food, clothes and food for livestock.
