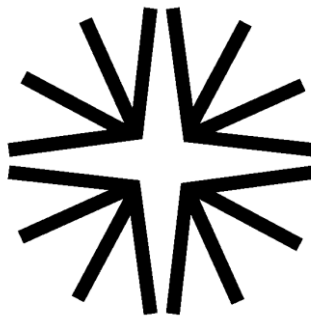

1. In accordance with the procedures at reference, EADRCC received on 29 August 2017, a request for assistance from Georgia. The following information was provided:

2. General Situation

Type of the Disaster : Forest and wild fires  
Date and Time the Disaster occurred : August 29<sup>th</sup> 10:00 AM and ongoing  
Location of the Disaster : Abastumani Resort, Samtskhe-Javakheti  
region of Georgia

3. **Assessment**

A major forest fire started on 29 August at 10:00 AM local time in a conifer forest near the Georgian National Astrophysical Observatory and has already affected around 5 hectares in the Abastumani Resort, Samtskhe-Javakheti Region of Georgia.

Inhabited areas are not yet under danger but could be affected by the fire. Some 400 first responders and personnel from Special Tasks Department and Emergency Management Agency of the Ministry of Internal Affairs, as well as representatives of Ministry of Environment and Natural Resources Protection of Georgia are dealing with the emergency. One Helicopter of the Border Police Services

has started firefighting operations 29 August 2017. Strong winds make a firefighting operation difficult.

4. Assistance provided:

- **Azerbaijan provided 1 firefighting helicopter.**
- **Ukraine provided 1 plane AN-32P.**
- **Turkey provided 2 helicopters and 1 firefighting aircraft.**

5. Following international assistance is required: Firefighting planes and helicopters with water buckets.
