### ACTIVE PROGRAMMES

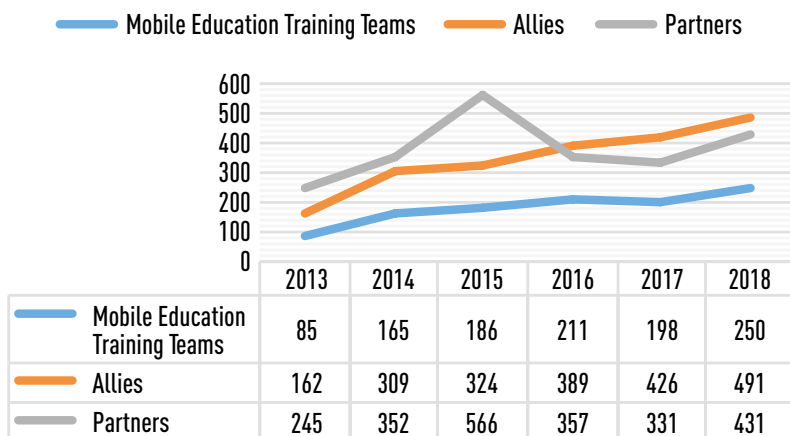
13 individual DEEP programmes run in Afghanistan, Armenia, Azerbaijan, the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia\*, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Mauritania, the Republic of Moldova, Mongolia, Serbia, Tunisia and Ukraine.
