NATO's Parliamentary Arm Helps Further the Aims of the Alliance.

The North Atlantic Assembly (NAA), the collective parliamentary voice of the Alliance, plays an essential role in building consensus for NATO's adaptation to the new security environment. It brings together parliamentarians from member countries, partner countries, as well as from the Mediterranean, promoting increased awareness, trust and cooperation, and thus bolstering stability in Europe. Mr. Lunn suggests that the occasion of NATO's 50th anniversary summit in Washington next year offers an opportunity to strengthen the relationship between NATO and its parliamentary arm and for the Alliance to give greater recognition to the NAA's role in their common endeavours.
